

MONGOLIA - GO NOMADIC



Mongolia, twice as big as Texas and with less than 3 mill. inhabitants, has the lowest population density of any independent country. And it is this vast and majestic emptiness, that is the country's enduring appeal, bringing travellers, as it does, into a close communion with its stunning nature and its nomadic traditions.

A land of undisturbed nature and untouched culture, endless intriguing deserts, tundra forrests, vast grassland and steppes, majestic snowcapped mountains, crystalclear lakes, rich and ancient culture dating back to the time of the great Genghis Khan.

Its capital, Ulaanbaatar, with over 1,5 mill inhabitants, is a large city of pulsating commerce, noisy traffic and buzzing urban life and in between islands of serenity – quiet monastery courtyards and public squares with calming fountains. The river Tuul Gol, offers a cool respite, while the four holy mountains surrounding the city provide its backdrop.

We hereby present selection of roundtrips in Mongolia including the Gobi Desert in the South and the Lake Khuvsgul in the North of the country and the central parts of Mongolia with the capital, Ulaanbaatar, and the Terejl and Khustai National Parks. Ulaanbaatar has a suitable choice of comfortable 3- 4- and 5- star hotels. Accommodation outside Ulaanbaatar is taking place in traditional Mongolian Ger Camps including new and more superior Ger Camps. Transport in the Gobi Desert and around Lake Khuvsgul is done with modern Japanese 4WD jeeps and the tours include encounters with the nomads on the steppes, camel and horse riding and getting acquainted with century old traditions.

Mongolia can easily be combined with Russia and China and we also offer tours combining Irkutsk and the Lake Baikal with Mongolia and tours combining Mongolia with the great ancient cities of China.



Day 3: Ulaanbaatar – Khustai National Park

Breakfast, 09.00 transfer to Khustai National Park (120 km), 12.00 check-in and lunch at Khustai Ger Camp (standard), 14.00-17.00 Tour of the Khustai National Park and see the famous wild Przewalski Horses, The park lies in the foothills of southern Khentii mountain range and it is the place to watch the wild Przewalski horses. The wild horses survive in nature by themselves and they have been reintroduced successfully to their homeland after 40 years of extinction. Currently, there is almost 200 Przewalski horses living in the park. 19.00 Dinner at Khustai Ger Camp



Day 4: Khustai National Park - Terelj National Park

Breakfast, 09.00 transfer to Terelj National Park (185 km), 12.00 check-in and lunch at Alungoo Ger Camp (superior), 14.00-18.00 tour of Terelj National Park, Terelj National Park, located in the Khentii Mountain range. The park is popular because of its gigantic granite rock formations, alpine forests and flower scenery. Visit Turtle Rock and Aryabal Monastery, 19.00 dinner at Alungoo Ger Camp

Day 5: Terelj National Park - Ulaanbaatar

Breakfast, 09.00 continue the excursion in Terelj National Park and traditional BBQ lunch with nomad family, 13.30 return to Ulaanbaatar (65 km). En route visit to Genghis Khan Equestrian Statue Complex, a 40-meter tall statue of Genghis Khan on horseback, on the bank of the Tuul River at Tsonjin Boldog. Visitors walk to the head of the horse through its chest and neck to enjoy a breathtaking panoramic view. 16.00 check-in at Hotel Bayangol****, leisure, 20.00 dinner at Restaurant "Khan Ger", return to hotel

Day 3: Bayangobi - Kharkhorin

Breakfast, 09.00 transfer to Kharkhorin (375 km), the ancient capital of Great Mongolian Empire and one of the stop-overs of the legendary Silk Route. 13.00 Check-in and lunch at Kharkhorin Anar Ger Camp (standard), 15.00-18.00 Visit the Erdenezuu Monastery, the first Buddhist monastery of Mongolia with an extraordinary collection of Buddhist paintings, religious objects and dresses. 19.00 dinner at Anar Ger Camp

Day 4: Kharkhorin - Middle Gobi (Ongi Monastery)

Breakfast, 09.00 drive in the direction of south, to the semi-desert Gobi land (250 km). En route BBQ lunch with a nomadic family. 14.00-17.00 visit to the ruins of Ongi Monastery, founded in the 17th century and the main religious centre of South Mongolia, where monks practice Buddhist philosophy, astrology and medicine. 18.00 check-in at Ongiin Nuts Ger Camp (standard), 19.00 Dinner at Ongiin Nuts Ger Camp

Day 5: Gobi Desert (Bayanzag)

Breakfast, 09.00 drive into the Gobi desert to explore the ancient red rock creation, Bayanzag (250 km), formed 60-70 million years ago. 13.00 Check-in and lunch at Goviin Naran Ger Camp (superior), 14.00-17.00 Visit to the Bayanzag Cliffs. The striking red Bayanzag Cliffs, known as the Flaming Cliffs, named by Roy Andrew Chapman, an American explorer who visited Mongolia in 1920s, contains vast amounts of dinosaur fossils, eggs and bones and is neighbored by bushy Saxual tree forests. 19.00 Dinner at Goviin Naran Ger Cam



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Day 6: Gobi Desert (Khongoriin Els)

Breakfast, 09.00 continue to the magnificent Khongoriin Els sand dunes (175 km), that stretch for an extraordinary 180 km and are until 20 km wide. The sand dunes lie on the northern part of the mountain range Servei and Zuulun. The sound of masses of wind-blown sand can be heard from a long distance. 13.00 check-in and lunch at the at the Gobi Anar Ger Camp (standard), 14.30-17.00 trekking in the sand dunes, 19.00 dinner at Gobi Anar Ger Camp

Day 7: Gobi Desert (Gurvan Saikhan)

Breakfast, 09.00 drive to the majestic Gobi Gurvan Saikhan National Park (200 km) to enjoy the incredible Yol Valley, 12.00 check-in and lunch at Govinn Naran Ger Camp (superior). 13.30-17.00 Tour of the Yol Valley. The valley is the unusual narrow canyon of a river that flows through the Zuun Saikhan Mountain. The sheer rock walls stand 200 m and the canyon has stunning green meadows with thick glacier layer that is deeply set between the walls. During the summer rainfall, water runs from the top of the walls forming waterfalls. 19.00 dinner at Goviin Naran Ger Camp



Day 8: Middle Gobi (Baga Garziin Chuluu)

Breakfast, 08.00 depart in the direction of Middle Gobi (400 km). En route meet the nomads on the steppe with their hordes of sheep, cattle and horses, a picnic lunch, 17.00 arrival and check-in at Erdene Ukhaa Ger Camp (standard), 19.00 dinner at Erdene Ukhaa Ger Camp

Day 9: Middle Gobi - Ulaanbaatar

Breakfast, 08.00 departure to Ulaanbaatar (200 km). Scenic drive through the Baga Gazriin Chuluu, basalt and granite rock mountain and visit to ruins of 17th century Buddhist Meditation Temple, picnic lunch, 15.00 Arrival in Ulaanbaatar and check-in at Hotel Bayangol****, leisure, 20.00 dinner at Restaurant "Khan Ger", return to hotel

The wonderful red Bayanzag Cliffs contain vast amounts of dinosaur fossils, eggs and bones and is neighbored by bushy Saxual tree forests. 13.00 check-in and lunch at the at Goviin Naran Ger Camp (superior). 14.30-18.00 drive to Moltsog Els Sand Dunes (45 km). The sand dunes continue for 40 km and are surrounded by thick Saxual forest. Visit to the sand dunes and camel riding. Return to Goviin Naran Ger Camp, 20.00 "Khorkhog" BBQ dinner at Goviin Naran Ger Camp.

Terelj National Park is located in the Khentii Mountain range and the park is very popular because of its gigantic granite rock formations, alpine forests and flower scenery. Visit Turtle Rock and Aryabal Monastery, 19.00 dinner at Alungoo Ger Camp

Day 6: Terelj National Park

Breakfast, 09.00 Continue the excursion in Terelj National Park and traditional BBQ lunch with a nomad family, 13.00-17.00 Excursion to the Genghis Khan Equestrian Statue Complex, a 40 meter tall statue of Genghis Khan on horseback, on the bank of the Tuul River at Tsonjin Boldog. Visitors walk to the head of the horse through its chest and neck to enjoy a breathtaking panoramic view, return to Alungoo Ger Camp, 19.00 dinner at Alungoo Ger Camp

Day 7: Terelj National Park - Murun - Lake Khuvsgul

Breakfast, 07.30 Transfer to Genghis Khan Airport, 10.40 departure with Hunnu Airlines bound for Murun, 12.00 Arrival to Murun, capital of Khuvsgul province, and drive to Lake Khuvsgul, second largest freshwater lake in the Central Asia with 262m depth. 14.00-17.00 Arrival at Lake Khuvsgul and tour along the banks of the lake. This gorgeous lake is fed by 96 rivers and streams but only the Egiin River flows out from the lake. Khuvsgul Lake is inhabited by nine species of fish, while the nearby taiga forest, forest steppe, mountains and the lake provide habitat for 68 species of mammals. The lake is surrounded by dozens of stunning mountains, thick pine forests and lush meadows with grazing yaks and horses. 17.00 check-in at Dul Ger Camp (standard), 19.00 Dinner at Dul Ger Camp



Day 8. Lake Khuvsgul

Breakfast, 09.00-17.00 Whole tour of the area around Lake Khuvsgul. In the morning, we will hike in the surrounding forest mountains to have a better look of the crystal blue lake. There are horse riding and fishing opportunities around the lake, picnic lunch, in the afternoon, drive to the north to visit Reindeer Village and experience Tsaatan, the reindeer breeders, and their everyday life and traditional tent dwellings "Urts". 

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

Ger Camps Descriptions

Terelj, Alungoo Ger Camp (superior)

The camp is situated in the in the Terelj National Park surrounded by forest mountains, uniquely formed granite rocks and a wide-open valley. The ger camp is 65 km away from Ulaanbaatar to the east and the location of the camp gives easy accessibility to Gunj Temple, Turtle Rock, Aryabal Monastery and nomads. Alungoo is a newly established ger camp and opened in 2013. There are 27 en-suite gers complete with modern bathroom facilities. There are three ger-shaped restaurants and a pub.

Khustai, Khustai Ger Camp

The camp is located 100 km from Ulaanbaatar city to the east, at the entrance to Khustai National Park. It is ideally situated for exploring the reserve that is home to the wild Mongolian Przewalski, horses and also offers bird watching, photo opportunity of untouched nature. The camp has 14 fully furnished gers with 2-4 single beds in each. Furnishings are traditional and colourful, featuring bright weavings and carved and painted wooden beds. A separate shared bathhouse provides bathroom facilities. The on-site restaurant serves a wide variety of Mongolian and western dishes. There are sauna, conference hall, information centre, laundry, souvenir shop. The main activities in the camp are horse riding and visit nomad families.

Kharkhorin, Kharkhoriin Anar Ger Camp

Kharkhoriin Anar Ger camp is situated in a very picturesque place on the bank of the Orkhon River and it is 375 km away from Ulaanbaatar and 5 km away from Erdenezuu Monastery. The camp consists of 45 gers and a ger-shaped 100-seat restaurant, which features traditional Mongolian song and dance performances.

Ongi Monastery, Ongiin Nuuts Ger Camp

The Ongiin Nuuts Ger Camp is located at Saikhan Ovoo Sum in the Dundgobi province, ca 515 km away from Ulaanbaatar. 45 gers can accommodate up to 100 guests. The restaurant is able to serve up to 120 people and offers both Mongolian and European meals. The camp has a remarkable architecture and is built of natural wood and stone

Gobi Desert, Hanhongor Soum, Goviin Naran Ger Camp (superior)

Unveiled in 2014, the Goviin Naran Ger Camp is located in the Gobi Desert in the south of Mongolia, at Hanhongor Soum, 30 km from the province capital of Dalanzadgad and close to some of the main sights of the Gobi Desert, 50 km from Bayanzag, 50 km from Yol Valley and 40 km from Moltsoq Els Sand Dunes. The camp has 24 en-suite gers complete with private bathroom facilities, 5 double gers and 19 twin gers. The ger camp has a separate restaurant building offering capacity for 60 guests and featuring Mongolian and European cuisine. The ger camp offers possibility of arranging BBQ dinners and archery. Guests can visit the desert nomads near the camp, enjoy camel trekking and experience the daily life of the nomads.

Khongoriin Els, Gobi Anar Ger Camp

The camp is located 640 km from Ulaanbaatar in the south-west and 190 km from Dalanzadgad, center of South Gobi province, 15 kms from the beautiful sand dunes. There are 30 gers to accommodate 70 guests, standard shower and rest room facilities, 2 restaurants serving European, Asian and Mongolian meals, souvenir shop, snack shop, dessert bar, BBQ place, game corner (Mongolian traditional games, chess, etc), sand tanning place and sand volleyball field. The camp offers horse, camel riding, introduction to nomadic way of living (setting up the ger, tasting of traditional homemade dairy products, milking camel), vehicle rent



Middle Gobi, Erdene Ukhaa Ger Camp

Erdene Ukhaa Ger Camp is located in the Middle Gobi Province near Baga Gazryn Chuluu. The camp has 15 gers to accommodate 40 guests. The ger-shaped restaurant can serve 45 guests. The camp offers such activities as camel trekking, hiking, visit to a nomadic family, traditional games.

Khuvsgul, Dul Ger Camp

Dul Ger Camp is located 783 km from the center of Ulaanbaatar and 103 km from Murun city. The camp has 20 gers with comfortable 2-4 bedded gers, flush toilet, shower, sauna, restaurants with Mongolian, Asian and European cuisine. The camp offer hiking around Khuvsgul Lake, visit to reindeer families, horse and yak riding, boat cruising, fishing, the shaman customs, trekking by yak cart. The guests can also enjoy traditional mongolian cultural performance, anklebone games and bonfires

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General

We offer accommodation in single or twin occupancy in traditional Ger Camps. The superior Ger Camps have new modern gers with private facilities. Standard Ger Camps have sanitary facilities including hot showers and restroom facilities in separate buildings. The gers have daily housekeeping.
